- Best Overall Advertising Campaign (The Classics Never Go Out of Style): Camelot Homes and Kitchen Sink Creative.
- Best Logo Design: Paradigm by Camelot Homes and Circle Road and Jason Cardenas.

The MAME Awards recognize builders, developers, architects, interior designers, sales and marketing professionals, and construction leaders for their achievements, and this year, over 20 builders participated in more than 60 categories, according to a press release.
